

### On-Track Markers (College of Liberal Arts)

The University considers timely completion of the following general education requirements an indication that a student is “on track to graduate.” Students who postpone completing these requirements often encounter problems in other courses, due to a lack of the foundational instruction provided in these courses. In addition, students who do not attempt to complete/demonstrate these requirements within the designated credit accrual may see their intended graduation dates delayed.

Requirement	Timeline
English 101 and 102	by 30 credits
First Year Seminar	by 30 credits (preferably in their first semester)
Intermediate Seminar	between 30 credits and 60 credits
Quantitative Reasoning	by 30 credits
Writing Proficiency Requirement	By 60 credits (after 60, student will get a WPR hold)

Please keep these on-track markers in mind as you advise students: some students do not understand the importance of prioritizing these requirements. While this should not be done at the expense of following the necessary course sequence of the student’s major, these requirements should be placed in high priority.
