CONRES 690: Court Mediation Internship

This is a 6-credit course which involves both a regular class meeting and spending a half-day per week in court for four months. In court, students mediate actual cases under the direction of a supervisor/coach. Students are paced in courts in Quincy or Dorchester that are accessible by public transportation. There is also a required two-day pre-court training workshop in January. Completion of the course fulfils requirements of the Guidelines for Implementation of Qualification Standards for Neutrals in Massachusetts.
