

UMass Boston, with 15,671 enrolled undergraduate and graduate students in fall 2023, is nationally recognized as a model of excellence for urban public universities. The university's 7 colleges and schools offer 68 undergraduate programs and 140 graduate programs (including master's and doctoral programs). The Honors College serves 511 students who thrive on intellectual challenge. Enriched courses probe more deeply into theory or venture further into application.

UMass Boston's diverse student body provides a global context for student learning. Its location in a major U.S. city provides connections to employers in industries such as finance, health care, technology, service, and education. 



Age of UMass Boston Undergraduates in 2023


