TWO PLUS TWO AGREEMENT FOR ARTICULATION OF ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

Between

Trustees of Boston College – Messina College

and

University of Massachusetts Boston

January 12, 2026

Subject to the following terms and conditions, Messina College and University of Massachusetts Boston (“Institution”) (the “Parties”) hereby enter into this articulation agreement (the “Agreement”) to facilitate the transfer of certain students enrolled in Associate’s degree programs at Messina College to a bachelor’s degree program at the University of Massachusetts Boston.

When it comes to the implementation and oversight of this Agreement, and to serve as initial primary points of contact at each institution, Institution’s designated representative will be Michael Parcella, Coordinator of Transfer Credit and Transfer Pathways and Messina College’s designated representative will be the Dean of Messina College.

1. Student Admissions and Enrollment

- a. Messina College students who graduate from Messina College with an associate’s degree, with full time status, who have a cumulative GPA of at least 2.5, who have remained in good disciplinary standing throughout their matriculation at Messina College, who apply to Institution within one year of completing their associate’s degree, and do not attend another college or institution after completion of their associate’s degree, under this Agreement shall be accepted into a bachelor’s degree program at Institution. Institution will accept the transfer of Messina College credits as set forth in Appendix A-G herein and apply such credits towards the bachelor’s degree program at Institution. Students who have a GPA below 2.5 can be considered on a case-by-case basis for admission. Students interested in the College of Management programs must meet the specific admissions criteria set forth in Appendix E. Students interested in academic programs that are not outlined within the Appendix A-G may apply for admissions to these programs but will not be guaranteed acceptance into those academic programs.
- b. Messina College students seeking admission to Institution under the Agreement will submit the requisite application materials to Institution, including official transcripts from all colleges attended adhering to Institution admissions deadlines.
- c. This agreement does not apply to students who previously matriculated at Institution as a degree seeking student. Previous Institution degree seeking students apply for re-enrollment through the Institution Registrar’s office and not through Undergraduate Admissions.

2. Financial Aid and Scholarships

Students may apply to and be considered for University of Massachusetts Boston Transfer Scholarships. Students who submit the FAFSA or MASFA by Institution deadlines to maximize all available federal, state, and university aid.

3. Term

This Agreement is effective as of the Effective Date written above, and it is expected to remain in effect indefinitely. The Agreement may be amended from time to time by mutual written agreement of the parties or terminated by either party with prior written notice to the other. Any such termination shall not affect students who have already been accepted into Institution under this Agreement. Termination shall be without penalty. Neither party shall be liable to the other for any monetary or other losses that may result.

4. Limitation of Liability

In no event shall either party be liable to the other party for any special, incidental, consequential, indirect, or punitive damages (including but not limited to loss of profits), regardless of whether such liability is based on breach of contract, tort, strict liability, breach of warranties, failure of essential purpose, loss of goodwill or otherwise, and even if advised of the possibility of such damages. Neither party shall be liable for any failure or delay caused by events beyond the party's reasonable control.

5. Other


- a. Neither party shall assign its obligations and duties under this Agreement without receiving the prior written consent of the other party. None of the benefits or obligations of either party under this Agreement shall run to or be enforceable by any student or other third party. There are no third-party beneficiaries to the Agreement.
- b. The parties shall comply with all applicable local, state and federal laws and regulations and will not discriminate on the basis of race, religion, color, sex, national origin or country of ancestral origin, age, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, or veteran status in the admission or access to this program.
- c. If either party accesses, transmits or stores records of the other party that are subject to the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act ("FERPA"), 20 U.S.C. Section 1232g ("FERPA Records"), such party acknowledges and agrees that such is under the direct control of the party owning or controlling such FERPA records with respect to the use and maintenance of the FERPA Records and further represents, warrants, and agrees that it will: (a) hold the FERPA Records in strict confidence and will not use or disclose the FERPA Records except as permitted or required by the Agreement, required by law, or otherwise authorized by the other party in writing; (b) safeguard the FERPA Records according to commercially reasonable administrative, physical and technical standards; (c) continually monitor its operations and take any action necessary to assure that the FERPA Records are safeguarded in accordance with the terms of this Agreement; (d) restrict access by such party's

employees to FERPA records, except as necessary to process the activities contemplated by this Agreement or store the data as required under the Agreement; and (e) use and retain FERPA Records only for the purposes for which they were intended.

- d. Institution and Messina College agree to collaborate in the areas of publicity, marketing, announcements, and recruitment in connection with the Agreement and the opportunities thereunder. It is understood and agreed that Messina College and Institution may inform appropriate academic and administrative personnel, as well as students and prospective students about the opportunities under this Agreement. Such effort may include communicating information about this Agreement in appropriate program materials and in verbal, written, and/or electronic communications. Except as set forth herein, the parties agree not to use each other's name or other trademarks in publicity, marketing or other materials without the prior written permission of the other.
- e. It is understood and agreed that each party has the right and responsibility to make changes to its curricula and enrollment standards to maintain its academic integrity and meet accreditation standards. Such changes, if any, will be communicated in writing between the parties as they occur.
