- ☐ Attend at least 1-2 additional MAP events.

Spring Semester

- ☐ Make an appointment at ACES to review your resume.
- ☐ Create a LinkedIn Profile.
- Upload your final resume to both Handshake and LinkedIn.
- Attend at least one career development event.
- □ Pursue a job or internship relating to your studies. Any experience is good experience!
- ☐ Attend at least 2-3 MAP events.

31-60 credits

Fall Semester

- $\hfill\Box$ Draft your first cover letter.
- Develop your resume highlighting student club activity, classroom project work, and other noteworthy accomplishments.
- ☐ Attend the Business, Finance, and Accounting Expo.
- $\hfill\Box$ Identify internship areas of interest.
- ☐ Attend at least 2-3 MAP events.
- ☐ Attend the Campus Employment Fair, Student Involvement Fair, and join a club.

Spring Semester

- ☐ Review your resume, cover letter, and LinkedIn profile with career services.
- ☐ Prepare for your internship. Use Handshake to discover and apply for opportunities.
- Look for part-time summer jobs pertaining to your career interests if you do not secure an internship, such as the <u>BEST Boston</u> <u>Program</u>.
- ☐ Attend at least one spring Career Expo.
- ☐ Attend at least 2-3 MAP events.
- Increase your campus involvement through volunteer opportunities or finding a job.

61-90 credits

Fall Semester

- Search for an internship, review your resume and cover letter, and prepare for internship interviews.
- Research organizations of interest using Handshake, LinkedIn, or Glassdoor and conduct informational interviews.
- ☐ Attend at least 2-3 career-focused MAP events.
- Explore graduate school options including Accelerated Master's Programs (AMP) here at UMass Boston.
- Prepare for job interviews by attending workshops and signing up for mock interviews.
- ☐ Attend the Business, Finance, and Accounting Expo.
- Enhance your LinkedIn profile to help market yourself and connect with UMass Boston alumni at target employers.
- ☐ Join BEACONconnect to find UMass Boston alumni in your field.

Spring Semester

- Pursue part-time summer jobs pertaining to your career interests if you do not secure an internship, such as the <u>BEST Boston Program</u>.
- ☐ Attend at least 2-3 career-focused MAP events.
- ☐ Pursue professional certifications you might need such as a CPA or CFA.
- ☐ Start GMAT preparations if planning to go to graduate school.
